#### **CALM DOWN YOUR FEARS**

Antony de Mello tells this story...

One day a Searcher came to the Master for enlightenment in a small hut on a mountain. It was a rainy day, so the visitor wore wooden clogs and carried an umbrella. When he walked in, the Master greeted him with, "You left your wooden clogs and umbrella on the porch didn't you? Tell me, did you place your umbrella on the right side of the clogs or on the left?" The Searcher was embarrassed, for he did not know the answer. He realized he lacked awareness. The person who is ceaselessly aware: the person who is totally there each moment; behold the Master!

Today's Gospel tells about the lack of awareness of the disciples about the presence of Jesus even when he was with them! The disciples thought that they were going to be perished in the storm. In their panic they woke him up and asked, "Do you not care that we are perishing." But Jesus gently chided his men of little faith. We can find ourselves with the fearful disciple in many life's storms. We hear a lot of cries of helplessness. Perhaps we rely on our power and capacity than one who conquered death and sin. ### **DID YOU KNOW?**

#### **LATIN INSCRIPTIONS:**

##### **R.I.P.**

*Requiescat in pace* (may he/she rest in peace) is a common funeral prayer and grave inscription.

##### **Beatae Memoriae**

"Of happy (or blessed) memory" is a familiar phrase on tombstones and memorial plaques.

##### **Obit**

A common inscription in church records and in cemeteries, "He/she died," followed by the date.

##### **Aetatus suae**

There was a day when a tombstone or an old family Bible might read "Died *aetatis suae* 52" (or A.S. 52), meaning "in the fifty-second year of his/her age." The full phrase is *anno aetatis suae*, "in the year of his/her age."

##### **Hic iacet (or jacet)**

"Here lies" is a tombstone inscription.
