The Environmental Stewardship Meeting was held last Thursday with most parish committees represented at the meeting. Thomas Burke, Electrical and Mechanical Project Manager with the Ottawa Catholic School Board, was a guest. He identified ways we can support both environmental and financial stewardship. Nicole Sammut spoke of her work with the Heritage Canada Foundation, noting how greening projects can help sustain church buildings. Many positive suggestions came forth for consideration in coming months by parish pastoral council and parish committees. Areas under consideration include energy conservation grants, solar energy, and waste management, purchasing guidelines, faith-based environmental education programs, youth involvement, parish-school partnerships, parish gardens, liturgical practices and parish bulletin entries. We all have a role to play. In the words of Canadian scholar Marshall McLuhan, "There are no passengers on spaceship earth. We are all crew."
